American Legion Membership Updates...

On July 30, 2019 the Charter of The American Legion was updated when Congress approved, and President Trump signed into law the L.E.G.I.O.N. Act. This Act changes the periods of membership eligibility for the American Legion from the 7 recognized war-time periods - WWI, Vietnam, Lebanon/Grenada, Korea, Panama, and the Gulf War/War on Terror that were previously authorized by Congress. Now, the periods of membership eligibility have been simplified to include WWI, and all US veterans that have served honorably since December 7, 1941 up to the end of the War on Terror as determined by Congress. Why the change? The American Legion found that 12 unrecognized war periods in which U.S. military personnel were put in harm's way, resulting in approximately 1,600 members of the Armed Forces being killed or wounded. This change allows those veterans who served during these periods of unrecognized conflicts to be able to join the American Legion and our work in our communities. L.E.G.I.O.N. Act - Let Everyone Get Involved in Opportunities for National Service - recognizes these veterans service to their country.

This change effects all three branches of the American Legion Family. Obviously, it welcomes a new group of veterans to membership in the American Legion. The male descendants of these newly eligible veterans are now also eligible to join the Sons of the American Legion. The spouses of these newly eligible veterans are also now eligible to join the American Legion Auxiliary.

The American Legion Auxiliary also had its Charter updated during the 2019 American Legion National Convention in Indianapolis. The word "wives" was replaced with "spouses" to reflect the changing world of the U.S. military. Today, 10% of all active duty military personnel are female and this change allows their spouses to take part in the mission of the American Legion with their families too!

We look forward to including these long over-looked veterans and their families in our American Legion Family.

Post Summer BBQ

On Sunday, August 18th, 2019 our Post held our annual Summer BBQ in our Post Hall. We were pleased to see 56 people in attendance. It was an enjoyable afternoon of small talk and catching up with everyone after our Summer break. The food was prepared by Theresa Capizola and was summer-time delicious! One new thing that we had for the BBQ was more than our usual 50/50 drawing. The first prize was the 50/50 which SAL Cmdr James Calbo won and donated back to the Post. Thanks James! Then we had 2nd through 15th prizes drawn from the 50/50 tickets for 14 bottles of liquor that were donated. While it seemed that some tables came out clear winners, everyone was laughing about who bought their tickets before and after those winners!

During this BBQ our Post took a few minutes to honor a young woman, Beth Regan, who most of you remember for her efforts to organize a wonderful send-off for a local WWII veteran. This veteran had passed recently with no living family to attend his funeral. Beth organized an online campaign to have people come and attend the funeral of decorated WWII US Marine Robert Graham. She was very successful in this effort and over 200 people attended including veterans, Police Departments, Fire Departments, and members of the community. Unfortunately, Beth is now working in North Carolina and was unable to attend our BBO. Fortunately, her mother and father, Sue and James Regan, attended in her place and 'Face-Timed' Beth the proceedings live on their phone from our Hall! Our Post had requested recognition through the Department of New York American Legion for Beth and were pleased to present her with the Department's 'Red, White, and Blue Award'.

In addition, our Post presented Beth via 'Face-Time' with first-ever the 'Liborio DeFrancesco Award' for her service to America's veterans. This award was created with the support and recommendation of Post member Ed Donovan and his wife, Marie, in honor of recently Post Legionnaire Liborio DeFrancesco. Beth was presented with a beautiful plaque and an accompanying check for \$500! This

was a great way to recognize Beth and honor Lee at the same time.

Fundraising News

In order for our Yorktown Post to run our programs we are constantly keeping an eye open for new types of fundraising. Our Food Pantry Collection is Back!

For 10 of the past 11 years our Post has conducted a food collection to benefit the Montrose VA Food Pantry at 2 A & P Supermarkets in Yorktown. Last year, under new ownership of ACME they insisted upon numerous stipulations before they would allow us to conduct this collection. We missed the window to do it as a result. This year we returned and after three attempts to secure permission - we were granted it. On Saturday, October 5th, 2019 we will once again man tables outside the Yorktown ACME Market and the Shrub Oak ACME Market from 9 AM to 1 PM to collect food donations to benefit the veterans-in-need who rely on the Montrose VA Food Pantry to survive. We need a minimum of four volunteers for each location to alow for comfort breaks and emergencies. Please try to help with this vital event. Do You Feel The Pride?

Our Yorktown Post has been working with a winning formula for the past 9 years or so. We are very visible in our community and are easily contacted via phone, email, or letter.

In June we were called by a Somers newspaper regarding the closing of the Somers VFW Post, the Legion Post, and the Jewish War Post there. It was sad way to find out about these closings. In September a Post member relayed a message that a member of the Elmsford Legion Post was asking what to do with their Post's bank accounts, since they haven't been active in a couple of years. We contacted the County American Legion Membership Chairman and he reached out to their final 9 Post members, who never attended any meetings, and they hope to try to revitalize their Post to try to save it. We were recently contacted by the Garden Club of Yorktown who wants to donate a Blue Star Memorial to the town. They asked if we could help them arrange a ceremony and dedication for November 11th and we agreed. Rehabiliation in Purdys called us again to come

visit around Veterans Day and be a part of their honoring of their veteran residents there. Their local Legion Post there is not active. We have done this the past 4 -5 years with a few Post members and their veterans love it. We do too! On two upcoming back-to-back weekends have us helping adaptive veterans on a bike ride with a 'rest-stop' manned by our Post members and conducting a food collection for the veterans relying on the Montrose VA Food Pantry. Our SAL members visit with the veterans at the Country House in Yorktown each Friday morning bringing companionship to those who have served and outlived their families.

This summer our Post has been visible with our Honor Flag Ceremonies at Jack DeVito Veterans Memorial Field. During this ceremony we raise the burial flags of our fellow veterans up the flagpole there with their family present. Our Post members salute as the flag is raised. Three weeks later as their flag is lowered, our bugler plays Taps as we salute. People all around the park stop and witness this ceremony and talk with us afterwards learning more about the ceremony. We have done this 7 times this summer with 11 to 26 Post members attending each time.

Since June our Post has been called 8 times by a local funeral home to conduct our Rendering Honors ceremony veterans who had passed. Each time our Post answered this request with 9 to 15 Post members filing in to offer this final salute to these veterans as their families watch with pride.

If you have never taken part in any of our Post's ceremonies or events, don't let that stop you from coming to your first. We explain everything each time before we begin, so that we all know the ceremony. This is done so that we all look uniform and the ceremony looks impressive to the families.

YOUR Post is the strongest its been in years, even decades, because of all this visible activity. Everyone we encounter sees the pride our Post members display in everything we do large and small. Please join us for some events and enjoy our Post's pride first-hand!
